Guest Speaker

Steve Fullendorf introduced town councilman Nathaniel Evans as today's guest speaker. Mr. Evans spoke about the Strong at Heart Project that has been launched by the town of Taos. A few council members attended a conference in Durango concerning projects to develop a vision for the future. The current 2020 Vision is approaching its end and the town wanted to develop a plan that was more transparent and involved more community input. In this manner, the community will start to take ownership of the plans.

Taos was selected to receive some funding and guidance. The town is currently in Phase 1 of the Strong at Heart Project. There was a community meeting, presentations have been made to service clubs and organizations and pop-ups have been held at different events. There have been three questions that have been asked:

- What do you love about Taos?
- Why do you love this?
- What would like to see in the future?

These questions will be used to gauge values, the need to shift and change, work together and have conversations with the community.

Phase 2 will be to have more reflection. Though we have the same values, why we care may be different. Community members will be able to discuss and see the depth of the challenges as we use this information in developing the town plan.

Phase 3 will help us identify goals and challenges in creating a new culture politically and as a community.

There is a 20-member Citizens' Advisory Council. There are opportunities for other presentations, hosting of meetings, etc. To date 800 comment cards have been filled out and collected. We can respond by taking the internet survey on: downtowntaos.com. These survey cards will also be at Fiestas and schools.
